	 PG Smith provided maps generated by FDOT, the Broward MPO, the County and by BRHPC, who generated health data on diabetes, transportation hubs, food retail square footage, and the 55+ population. MPO Criteria for Federal Fund Application	 R. Gutierrez explained that based on TAC feedback, the MPO staff is proposing a modification of the Transportation Alternative Program application process to reflect the importance of Complete Streets. Pending TCC and Board approval, there now will be four opportunities to earn additional points, based on the 4 categories (3 points each) developed by the TAC for a maximum of 12 possible points.
